What does the fund invest in?

This fund primarily invests in equity securities of companies in any country outside of Canada and the United States to provide investors with long-term capital appreciation and income. This exposure may be achieved by investing directly in such securities or by investing in other funds that invest in such securities.

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How risky is it?

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk rating

ATB Investment Management Inc. has rated the volatility of this fund as **Medium**.

Because this is a new fund, the risk rating is only an estimate by ATB Investment Management Inc. Generally the rating is based on how much the fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund.

How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund outside a registered plan, fund distributions are included in your income for tax purposes, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series I units of the fund. The fees and expenses - including any commissions - can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds, series and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

- 1. Sales charges There are no sales charges applicable to Series I units.
- 2. Fund expenses You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund's returns. Because this series is new, its operating expenses and trading costs are not yet available.

More about the trailing commission

No trailing commission is paid by ATB Investment Management Inc. in respect of Series I units.

3. Other fees - There are no other fees associated with buying, holding, selling or switching securities of this fund.

What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
